

Transferring Domains to Go Daddy From Melbourne IT (aka Internet Names Worldwide)

Go Daddy can accept transfers from any registrar. With Go Daddy's Rapid Transfer System, domain transfers can often be completed in as little as five days or less. However, some transfers may take up to seven days to complete.

To transfer a domain from Melbourne IT (aka Internet Names Worldwide) to Go Daddy, you will need the following information:

- ✓ Domain status – Locked or Active
- ✓ Administrative contact for registered domain
- ✓ Authorization or EPP code (.com, .net, .org, .biz, .us, and .info TLDs only)

If you do not have that information on hand, you can obtain it from Melbourne IT. The domain transfer cannot succeed unless the domain name is unlocked, the administrative e-mail address is valid, and the correct authorization code is provided (for .com, .net, .org, .biz, .us, or .info domains).

See below for a description of the specific elements and issues involved in the Melbourne IT–Go Daddy domain transfer process.

Unlocking Domain

Domain names registered with Melbourne IT might have been placed in the user-controlled “Lock” status, which is displayed as “Registrar-Lock” at the registry. Before a domain transfer is requested, the lock must be removed and the registry status verified as

“Active.”

To unlock domain:

1. Log in to your Melbourne IT account at <http://www.melbourneit.com.au/cc/myaccount>

or

Log in to Domain Maintenance with your Melbourne IT Registry Key and Domain Name at <http://www.melbourneit.com.au/maintenance/>.

2. The current lock/unlock status is displayed at the top of the page in the form of an open (unlocked) or closed (locked) padlock symbol.
3. If the domain name in question is currently marked as locked, select the open (unlocked) lock, and the system will confirm your request.

If your domain name is managed by a Melbourne IT reseller, you must contact that reseller to arrange to unlock your domain. A fee for this service may apply.

Note: It may take 24 hours before the Go Daddy system identifies and recognizes the status change.

The Importance of the Administrative Domain Contact

The administrative contact is one of the four contacts listed in the Whois database for a registered domain. The contact information is defined by the registrant. As part of the domain transfer process, Go Daddy will send a transfer-approval e-mail message to the domain's administrative contact listed in the Whois database. The e-mail message contains the Transaction ID and Security Code that enable the administrative contact to approve the transfer.

If you have just removed the lock from a domain registered with Melbourne IT (the “unlock” procedure is described above), 24 hours should elapse before the administrative contact responds to the transfer approval e-mail message, as it can take up to 24 hours before Go Daddy recognizes changes to the domain's Whois information.

Attempting to respond to the transfer approval message before the status change has been completed will result in transfer failure. You will receive an instant e-mail notification of the failed transfer.

Changing Administrative Contact Information

To alter the contact information for your domain's administrative contact:

1. Point your browser to <http://www.melbourneit.com.au/>.
2. From the **DOMAIN NAMES** menu, select **MAKE CHANGES**.
3. The **Domain Management** page is displayed.
4. In order to modify your domain name details you will need the registry key that was sent to you upon registering the domain name.

If you have lost your registry key, click on the **Recovery Tool** link; then enter your domain name or account password and click **Recover Password**.

5. Enter your domain name and registry key in the applicable fields.
6. Click **Enter Management**.
7. Click **Contact Details**.
8. On the **Contact Details** page, modify the administrative contact information as needed.
9. Click **Process Changes**.
10. The message "Your Contact Information has been updated" is displayed at the top of the page.
11. Click on the **Main Menu** link to exit the **Contact Details** area.

Note: While the updates will be reflected in the Melbourne IT Whois data in less than 30 minutes, it may take up to 24 hours before Go Daddy recognizes the changes.

Authorization Code

In order to transfer a .com, .net, .biz, .info, org, or .us domain name you will need an authorization code. An authorization code is a unique code assigned by registrars to .com, .net, .biz, .us, .info, and .org domain names at the time of registration.

To obtain the authorization code for a .com, .net, .org, .info, .biz, or .us domain registered with Melbourne IT:

1. E-mail Melbourne IT at das@melbourneit.com.au and request the authorization code for the domain you wish to transfer. The request must include your domain name and registry key.
2. Melbourne IT will e-mail the code to the domain's administrative contact.

Transferring Domain

Assuming that the above issues are in order, the domain transfer process proceeds thus:

To transfer a domain to Go Daddy:

1. Advise the domain's administrative contact that the domain name is being transferred.
2. Go Daddy will e-mail the administrative contact by the next business day with instructions on how to approve the transfer.
3. Once the administrative contact has approved the domain transfer, Go Daddy will send a transfer request to the registry. If the domain's administrative contact does not have access to the Go Daddy account from which the transfer request was purchased, the recipient of the e-mail request must forward the Transaction ID and Security Code to someone who does. These codes must be entered on the **Pending Domain Transfer** screen in your Go Daddy account in order to approve the transfer. Once the Transaction ID and Security Code are successfully entered, Go Daddy will request the transfer at the registry. The registrar of record then has five (5) calendar days to deny the transfer. If the registrar of record does not deny the transfer, the transfer is automatically approved.
4. The registry will contact Melbourne IT via e-mail.
5. Melbourne IT will send an acceptance or rejection notice to the registry. If the registrar fails to deny the transfer within five days, the registry will move the domain registration to Go Daddy.
6. The registry will notify Go Daddy of the acceptance or rejection.
7. Go Daddy will inform you via e-mail that the transfer is complete.

Should the domain transfer fail, Go Daddy will notify you via e-mail. You may resubmit

your transfer request if the transfer fails. However, to ensure that the information listed in your transfer request remains valid, you will have 30 days from the time of your purchase to complete the transfer at Go Daddy.
